Project Compassion at Saint Joseph's

Recently, your child should have brought home a small money box for 'Project Compassion'. Project Compassion is the annual Lenten fundraiser for Caritas, a Catholic agency for international aid.

Last week, all students watched a video, showing an example of a village in Africa that has been helped through the Project Compassion appeal. A twelve-year-old girl from the village walks to a crocodile-infested river each morning, to fill and carry a heavy water bottle back to her village; a 14km round trip! Caritas was able to equip the village with a solar powered water pump, meaning that the community has running water for the first time. I was very impressed with the empathetic response of our students to this video. I encourage you as a family to donate what you can into your Project Compassion box- every coin counts. 
Athletics Training and Carnival

Caritas Fundraising for Project Compassion

As we near Lent for 2019 we take the time to not only think about what Lenten sacrifice we may personally make, but also how we can help those in need around the world.

This year's Project Compassion fundraising activities are a little different from previous years. We will have two main fundraising events for all students to participate in over two different days.

- 1. Pancakes for Project Compassion: On Shrove Tuesday the 5th March (next Tuesday) we will be selling pancakes at recess for all students. Pancakes will cost 50c for one or \$1 for three. There will be two topping choices: Maple Syrup or Lemon and Sugar.
- 2. Water Carrying Challenge: On Tuesday March 19th in the morning students will participate in a Water Carrying Lap Challenge, to help students develop some understanding of what it may be like for children and families in some third world countries who need to walk long distances to get safe drinking water.

The children will participate in a "water carrying lap-athon" around the school oval.

There will be an Early Childhood and Upper primary circuit on the oval. Students will need to walk carrying a container of water (relative to their age and size) either on their head or in their arms around the oval for as many laps as they can in the designated time.
