Project-Based Learning at Saint Joseph's

Back in 2004, Larry Page and Sergey Brin, the founders of Google, had an idea to try. They instigated '20% time' in the Google offices. All staff were to devote 20% of their time (one day per week) to work on any passion project they liked, with no accountability whatsoever. Interestingly, some of Google's most successful new concepts were developed during this '20% time'. They also found that their employees were more productive on the other four days, while enjoying greater job satisfaction.

Many schools, including ours, are trialling a similar idea, with 'Genius Hour'. For one hour a week, our Year 6 students have been allowed to work on a project totally of their own choosing- solving real-world problems that matter to them. I can't wait to see what some of these bright young minds produce.

While traditional, explicit teaching methods will always have a place at Saint Joseph's, we hope to increasingly explore more student-driven styles of learning, often called 'PBL' or 'Project-Based Learning' in 2019.
