Parent Teacher interviews

On Monday. we have our Parent/Teacher interview evening. By now, you should have received a note confirming your time. Remember, children should not attend the meeting, but are welcome to sit and wait outside the room. Our teachers genuinely care about your child's well-being and care deeply about maximising their progress. These interviews could be a wonderful chance to strengthen the partnership between parent and teacher.

The meetings need to stick to a tight schedule, so it pays to be prepared, in order to make the most of this time you have with your child's teacher. These essential tips will make sure you maximise this valuable opportunity:

1. List important points before you go Spend five minutes prior to the meeting listing two or three questions or jotting down any information about your child that you'd like the teacher to know. This simple preparation will ensure that you don't forget to pass on mustknow information to the teachers.

2. Make a good impression — be friendly and positive

Make a good impression on your child's teacher by adopting a friendly, positive demeanour. Greet them with a warm smile and be mindful that they may be a little nervous themselves.

3. Take notes and clarify information you don't understand

Take a notepad with you so you can make a note of important points. Be prepared to clarify any information your teacher passes on that you don't understand. It's counter-productive to leave with more questions than when you arrived.

4. Be prepared to discuss your goals for the year

Think about your aspirations for your child for the coming year. If you are not asked directly, be prepared to share the goals you have for your child this year before you leave.

These goals and aspirations may be: academic ("I'd love him to improve his spelling!), social ("She's struggled making friends in the past so this year I'm hoping she makes two or three good friends.") or related to their behaviour ("I'm really working on teaching her to rein in her temper. I'm hoping you can help her with that this year.")

5. Pass on what they need to know

Don't leave the meeting without telling teachers important information about your child's health, family circumstances or behaviour that's likely to impact significantly on your child's well-being or learning during the year.

6. Follow-up with a thank you phone call or email

Cement your relationship by being one of the few parents who follow-up parent-teacher meetings with a phone call or email of gratitude for the way the meeting was conducted or even the interest the teacher showed in you and your child.

Research supports the fact that a strong parent-teacher partnership is one of the main keys to your child's success at school. This meeting hopefully will be the start of a fruitful and happy relationship with your child's teacher over the coming year.

'Our PhotoStories' Workshops in Manjimup

The Shire of Manjimup Libraries, the Manjimup Photo Club and the Southern Forests Photography Club are collaborating to host a **two-part** Our PhotoStories photography workshop with Astrid Volzke in Manjimup in April/May 2019.

Part 1 of the Our PhotoStories workshop will teach photography enthusiasts how to create a photo story using their cameras (from digital SLR cameras to smartphones). It will focus on teaching different photography skills including portraiture, capturing action, wide-angle and close-up details, storytelling and more.

Part 2 of the Our PhotoStories workshop will take place five weeks later.

Participants from the first workshop will return with small printouts of their photo stories to learn about editing and ordering them into a visual story for maximum effect.
