The Importance of Being a Dad Who Reads

I hope not to upset any of our amazing Saint Joe's mums with this article, but I would like to take this opportunity to highlight a 2015 study carried out at Harvard University. This study revealed that children benefit more from their father, rather than their mother, reading them bedtime stories. Dads, the research revealed, spark more "imaginative discussions" and are more instrumental to their children's language development because of the way they read to their kids. Admittedly, this was an American study, but I suspect a similar effect would exist in Australia.

Over the course of a year researching the impact that parents reading had upon their children, the study leader, Dr Elisabeth Duursma, found that girls in particular benefited more when read to by a male. "The impact is huge – particularly if dads start reading to kids under the age of two," explains Duursma. "Reading is seen as a female activity and kids seem to be more tuned in when their dad reads to them – it's special."

Hopefully, none of the boys at Saint Joe's perceive reading as something 'for girls'. I do know, however, that if boys see their dad reading at home (sometimes actual books, not only newspapers, form guides etc), they are going to be more likely to embrace and enjoy reading themselves. After all, while, yes, dads are supposed to protect, feed, and defend their children, they're also responsible for introducing their kids to the world around them. Books are remarkable tools for doing just that.

Unfortunately, a recent poll – of 1,000 mums and dads – by the charity Book Trust, found that only 13% of fathers are the main household reader. Worryingly, it seems that the younger the father, the less likely it is that they will enjoy reading to their children, with only 19% of dads under 25 saying they enjoy reading with their children- older age brackets polled higher.

So, yes, it is important for dads to read with the kids. But it's not because it's something we HAVE to do.



It's because, when we read with our kids, we have the chance to share some small part of ourselves with our children and that's an opportunity that no dad should miss.

Dads' Reading Day

So, as part of our BookWeek celebrations, all students are invited to bring in their dad (or grandad, uncle, older brother etc) for our Dads Reading Day on Friday 8th November. From around 8.45am-9.00am, all students can find a comfortable spot around the school to read with their special person. You might like to bring a favourite book from home or choose one from our school library. For those students who cannot bring a guest, they will spend some time reading with one of the teachers. Hope to see lots of special guests here for this exciting event!


