Welcome

The educators in the Kindy/Pre-Primary class are Mrs. Ruth Kelly, with the support of Mrs. Ronnie McRae. We have been working together in the ECE classroom at St Joseph's for the past 5 years. The students will also be taught by our school specialist teacher, Mr. Greg Kelly, during the week. These learning opportunities will include: Sport on Mondays, Science on Tuesdays and Library on Wednesdays.

Classroom Expectations

MJR and PBS

Making Jesus Real (MJR) and Positive Behaviours in Schools (PBS) are two whole school programs that are closely aligned to our school's philosophies. They are used to support the students in learning and developing positive attitude and social skills, often using Jesus as a role model for the choices and attitude to have towards others and our learning.

Timetable

Copy of our current timetable is attached. You will see that our timetable is closely aligned to the Year 1/2 class. This is to ensure that there is an easy transition for students as they move between the K/PP class and the PP/1/2 class.

Parent, Teacher Communication

We have a range of different ways to ensure that there is open communication between home and school.

Seesaw app: Each student has been set up with a Seesaw app account. This is a place that the students will be able to electronically share information and work with you, or I can share general information about events in the class with you all too.

Communication Book: These are books that will be sent home with your child every afternoon. We will write messages in the book and you can write us messages to us as well.

Also, all class and school notes will go into the book. Please ensure these books are returned to school each morning with your child.

Email or phone: You can always email me @ ruth.kelly@cewa.edu.au or if it is urgent, ring the school directly on 9776 1180 and I can speak to you. At times, I will also ask that you email information to me, such as photos of the children for different activities we are completing in class.

Face to face meetings: I am always happy to have a very quick general chat in the morning or afternoon at pick up or drop off if I'm not directly working with students. However, if you want to have a discussion about your child in more detail please see me or email or write a note in the Communication book and we can arrange a meeting at a time to suit us both.

Teaching and Learning

Religion – Term 1 topics are: The Church; and Lent/Easter

Keeping Safe Program – This program is taught once a week and is linked to our Health program. It helps your child develop some basic skills in personal safety and self-identity

ELLA – **Italian** Using an app, each child will participate in a range of games and tasks helping them develop an early understanding of the Italian language. It will help support them in Year 3 when they commence formal Italian lessons.

English — Reading — through a shared book and range of activities and games, the students develop early reading skills including basic concepts of print, recalling the main events and sequence of stories and retelling familiar stories in different ways.

Writing – our main focus this term is on developing oral language skills for the children to transfer into their writing in coming terms. This term we are focusing on recounts and narrative texts.

Spelling — The Pre-Primary students will continue to use the Di Rigg spelling programme, with the main focus on identifying beginning sounds in words and hearing each sound in a simple word (i.e. bat is b-a-t). The Kindy students are going to begin with the Pre-Lit programme as a whole group. This programme focuses on reading and spelling together, helping to ensure all foundation literacy skills are well established prior to commencing the Di Rigg spelling programme later in the year.

Mathematics – **iMaths:** This year, we are using a new Mathematics program across the whole school. This program uses a range of different investigations to support the students learning in all areas of maths. This term our investigations focus on reading and writing numbers, ordinal numbers (1_{st} , 2_{nd} , 3_{rd}) recording data in graphs and reading time.

HASS – Inquiry Learning: Following on for our success last year using big questions to encourage the students to think deeper and wonder more, we will continue to use Inquiry questions and lessons in our HASS and Health studies throughout the year. This terms 1st

Big question is "What Makes Me, me?" This is directly linked to History, Health and Religion.

Pre-Primary students will commence some very basic homework in late Term 1 or Term 2. This will require you to still read with your child, but also begin to support them in further developing their reading and writing skills with some simple games and tasks. It should NEVER take more than 10 minutes a night.
