Literacy

<u>Spelling</u>

In Spelling, students will continue to work at their specified level within the Diana Rigg Spelling Program.

<u>Reading</u>

In Reading, students are continuing the Flying Start to Literacy program. They will now be studying a narrative text of their selected topic.

<u>Writing</u>

In Writing in weeks 7 - 10 the students will be focusing on the features of a historical recount to eventually construct their own recount on a historical event.

Religion

In Religion we will be studying Lent for the remainder of the term

This unit explores choices and the impact a choice makes on peoples' lives. They will learn that the Catholic Church encourages people to develop habits for making good choices..

Your child will focus on the story of 'The temptation of Jesus in the Wilderness' as an example of Jesus being strengthened by God to overcome challenges and obstacles in life. This story will also remind them of the importance of always choosing to follow and celebrate Jesus, especially during Lent and Easter.

The Stations of the Cross is one way to celebrate Jesus and recall his suffering, death and raising from the dead. Through reflection of Jesus in their lives, your child will see how to make choices that follow his example and reflect God's love.

Maths

<u>Year 5</u>

In weeks 7-10 the year 5 students will focus on the following concepts based from the Measurement and Geometric strand and Number and Algebra strand.

- 24-hour time and reading and interpreting timetables.
- Multiplication of 3-digit and 2-digit numbers
- Lattice method of multiplication
- Division 3-digit by 1-digit numbers.
- Division with remainders.
- Latitude and longitude
- Using scale

<u>Year 6</u>

In weeks 7-10 the year 6 students will focus on the following concepts.

Number and Algebra

- Divison with remainders to hundredths
- Two-digit divisors
- The four operations
- Backtracking

Measurement and Geometry

- Metric system of measurement
- Perimeter and composite angles <u>Statistics and Probability</u>
- Probability
- Judgements

HASS

<u>History</u>

In History the students will continue to study the colonial life of Australia, the development of colonies, convict life and also the life of settlers.

Civics & Citizenship

In Civics & Citizenship, the students will be studying democratic values of equality, the roles and responsibilities of electors and representatives in Australia's democracy and the key features of the electoral process.

Business & Economics

In Business & Economics, the students will be exploring the types of resources (natural, human, capital) and the ways societies use them in order to satisfy the needs and wants of present and future generations.
