ENGLISH

<u>Spelling</u>

In Spelling, we are working from the Di Rigg spelling program and supplementing this with the Di Rigg dictation program.

Maths

Year 5

The year 5 students' will be starting the Term with a focus on the Number and Algebra strand followed by Measurement and Geometry strand of the National Curriculum. Within this strand the students will explore.

- <u>Place value</u>: Read, order, and compare decimal fraction to the thousandth.
- <u>Fraction and decimals</u>: Decimal fractions and percentages. Explore percentages as a fraction of 100 and convert fractions, decimals, and percentages.
- Decimal fractions: Add and subtract decimal to hundredths.
- Percentage: Percentages using a calculator.
- <u>Financial</u>: Develop a financial plan and records

Homework book has been sent home in week 1. If your child is having any difficulty with their homework, I am only too happy to help them.

Year 6

In the first five weeks of Term 3, the students will be covering the following topics.

- <u>Place value</u>: Decimal division, division of decimals, multiplication of decimals, renaming percent as fractions, discount and operations with money.
- <u>Measurement and Geometry</u>: Read and interpret timetables, add and subtract time, timetables and international timezones.

Supporting your child with Mathematics

Use mathematical words when describing things. For example, instead of saying "the big red bucket," you might say "the 10 Litre bucket". Instead of saying "the large packet of rice," you might say "the 2 kg packet of rice". In this way, children get to hear quantities being stated as an everyday way of describing things.

HASS

<u>History</u>

In History, students will be studying the Gold Rushes, colonial conflicts and transport in the 1800s in Australia.

Economics and Business

This term, students will be focusing on Economics and Business. They will be focusing on Aboriginal Australians use of resources and how they managed the land.

Religion

This Year 6 unit explores that God made people with a body and a soul, and that our soul helps us to be loving and good. Your child will learn that the soul is not a physical part of the body but will last forever even after physical death.

Before he rose to heaven, Jesus promised his disciples that he would send the Holy Spirit to help them to live as he taught and spread his message to others. This promise was fulfilled at Pentecost, when the Apostles received the Holy Spirit and began to spread God's message.

During the Sacrament of Confirmation, the gifts received at Baptism are strengthened by the Holy Spirit which helps people to live as Jesus taught. Your child will learn that when they use the gifts of the Holy Spirit people are able to think, speak and behave more like Jesus in their daily lives.
