# <u>Helping your child with Mathematics</u> Estimating

Estimating is an important activity and applies to all aspects of Mathematics. Whenever possible, ask your child/children to guess quantities. Some examples of estimating tasks that you might ask are:

- Estimate how far it is to a particular point in distance whilst driving.
- Estimate how many pieces of bread are in a loaf.
- Estimate how long it will be until you walk to a particular point.
