Dear Parents/Guardians,



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

This term we are researching a chosen Saint as in Week 4 our class will lead the All Saints Day Liturgy. We will be creating our own information report about our Saint so we can teach you all about them and what makes them so special. We will also explore the meaning of reconciliation and forgiveness as our Year 3 students will soon receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

HOMEWORK

This term your child will have Reading, Spelling and Mathematics homework. Please try to ensure that your child is reading each night. Please listen to your child read every night and talk to them about the book they read to help develop their comprehension skills. Homework will commence in Week 2.

UPCOMING EVENTS

MATHEMATICS

This term the Year 1 students will be learning the following:

- Mass Measure and compare the capacities of pairs of objects using uniform informal units.
- Probability Identify outcomes of familiar events involving chance and describe them using everyday language such as 'will happen', 'won't happen' or 'might happen'.
- Transformation Investigate the effect of onestep slides and flips with and without digital technologies. Identify and describe half and quarter turns.

This term the Year 2 students will be learning the following:

- Mass Compare and order several shapes and objects based capacity using appropriate uniform informal units.
- Probability Identify practical activities and everyday events that involve chance. Describe outcomes as 'likely' or 'unlikely' and identify some events as 'certain' or 'impossible'.
- Transformation Investigate the effect of onestep slides and flips with and without digital technologies. Identify and describe half and quarter turns.



ENGLISH

In English, we are beginning to explore poetry and how the author carefully chooses each word to make their audience feel a particular way. We are currently writing our very first Cinquain Poem. Each poem is filled with nouns, adjectives and verbs to describe a chosen topic. In the next few weeks, we will begin to explore some clever techniques to make our poems more exciting, including alliteration and similes. We can't wait to share our incredible poems with you!

ORAL LANGUAGE - NEWS

News will be conducted a little differently this term. Instead of each child bringing in an item each week, students will be allocated **1 week** to share their news. The News Timetable can be found in your child's Communication Book.

INQUIRY, HASS & DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGIES
