Term 4 learning is in full swing!

Our **inquiry** into how light and sound can be seen and heard is coming to a conclusion with the children soon creating their own musical instruments using different forms of vibrations.

Then, our final inquiry for the year will focus on the question, "How was Christmas celebrated when your parents were your age?" Hint, there might be a mini-interview coming home for you to complete to help the children gather some authentic data for their research reports.

In **Religion**, we are 'wrapping up' our unit of study on the Sacrament of Reconciliation and will shortly begin, "The Season of Advent and Christmas". This unit will link up with our final Inquiry for the year.

In **Maths** we are learning to tell the time and recite all the days, months and seasons of the year. In number we are focusing on revising and refining our number skills and knowledge, especially number reading and writing, place value and some simple addition and subtraction strategies ready for Pp/Yr 1 and Yr 2 next year.

In **Literacy**, we have turned our focus to some mini author studies during our shared reading sessions. The children have enjoyed comparing how different authors' books are similar and different and have had great fun becoming authors and illustrators themselves, generating some innovations based on the different authors' texts. Jez Alborough, Eric Carle and Alison Lester better watch out in the future! The Year Ones have also enjoyed having a go at some Accelerated Reader quizzes linked to our shared books and are all well on their way to reaching their full goal for the term. In Writing, the students have been enjoying listening to stories about the Magic Wishing Chair by Enid Blyton.

Through each adventure, they have been learning to describe characters with interesting adjectives, retell the stories by remembering all the events and will soon use their imagination to create their own adventures. Finally, after waiting patiently, the Wishing Chair arrived at school this week to take them on some adventures around the playground!

In **Art**, our bags are coming along nicely. The children are really listening well to instructions and being very careful with the large (semi-blunt) sewing needles!
