In Mathematics with Miss Buegge, students will be covering the following concepts for the beginning of the term supplemented by problem-solving activities.

HASS - Mrs Gandy

In the following weeks, we will continue to immerse ourselves further into the topic of natural resources and their significance in our environment. Students will investigate sustainable practices and their evolution over the years.





SCIENCE - Mr Kelly

For the remaining weeks of the term students will be developing an understanding of the observable properties and behaviours of gases by conducting some mini-investigations that will help them understand the properties of a gas. Also, students will develop an understanding of the properties of a gas, how a gas is used in our everyday lives and the safety considerations needed when using a gas by investigating this question. Is it easier to compress air or water?

STEM - Miss Buegge

Students will be continuing to research foods grown in our state and investigating all the equipment needed and processes involved in the production of the final product. They will present their information to the class using informative posters and PowerPoint presentations.

PHYS ED - Mrs Kristoffersson

We have finished up with our footy skills and are moving into basketball for the remainder of the term. We are working on our ball control and dribbling skills. We will be developing our passing and shooting skills and learning some fun scoring games. Defending and understanding space are important skills in basketball and we will be working on these during our game play.
